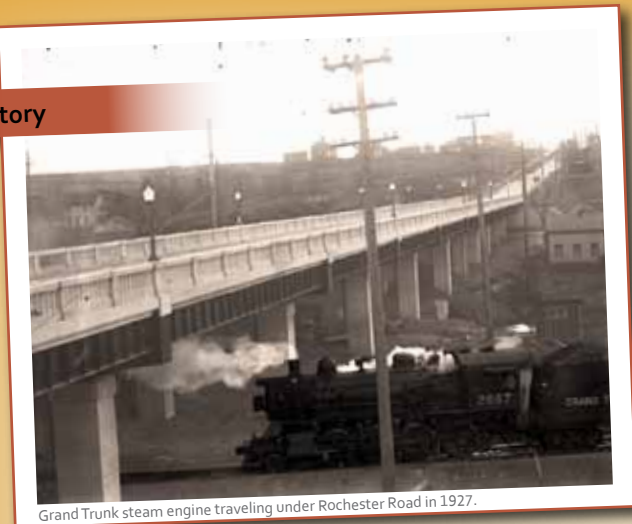

Imagine a time when steam engines roared down the tracks. Built around 1880, this section of railroad was originally known as the Michigan Air Line. The tracks were removed in 1998 and the conversion from rails to trail began.

Open year-round, the flat and level trail surface allows for a variety of recreational activities. The trail links neighborhoods, historic downtowns, other regional trails, parks, greenspaces and the river. Numerous events are held annually on the river and the trail. Walking and biking events, 5K and longer runs, adventure paddles, canoe races and guided learning hikes are common.

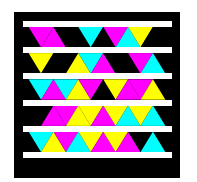
